

Introduction

The Urban League of Louisiana Parent Information Center (PIC) is proud to present the 2nd edition of the Baton Rouge Achievement Zone School Guide. PIC strives to empower parents to be successful agents and advocates for excellent schools and to educate parents about school choices.

The purpose of this guide is to equip parents and families with helpful information about the variety of public charter schools in the Baton Rouge Achievement Zone (BRAZ) community. This Guide contains information on all BRAZ schools, including their school features and programs.



About



WHAT IS THE BATON ROUGE ACHIEVEMENT ZONE (BRAZ)?

The Baton Rouge Achievement Zone (BRAZ) is a system of autonomous public charter schools serving more than 4,000 students in Louisiana's Capital City. BRAZ was created in response to the growing demand for great schools and more robust options for students throughout Baton Rouge. The result is a collaborative partnership between the Louisiana Department of Education, Recovery School District, New Schools for Baton Rouge and community, business and civic leaders across the parish. The goal of BRAZ is to create a system of autonomous high-performing schools designed around the needs of children that prepare them for college and careers and engages local citizens in the push for quality educational outcomes for all Baton Rouge communities.

BRAZ Schools (@BRAZSchools) are focused on creating high expectations, inspiring innovation and imagination, and preparing students for the opportunities of the future.



WHAT IS ENROLL BATON ROUGE (ENROLLBR)?

Enroll Baton Rouge (EnrollBR) is a common application process created to ensure that all children have fair access to an excellent education, through the ease of a centralized application system for select schools in Baton Rouge. Our goal is to empower parents and families with school choice, by informing them of the options available so that they can select a school that will meet the needs of their child(ren). This system can be accessed both electronically and through a limited number of paper applications.





Why should you choose your child's school?

Thanks to the growth of school networks in Baton Rouge, there is no longer the need to choose the school that your child is automatically zoned to attend, you now have the choice to send your child to a school that meets all of his/her academic, developmental and social needs - regardless of its location.

Although choice has its benefits, knowing how to navigate through all of your options is just as important. Every child is different, and this fact should be acknowledged when selecting the right school. While choosing a school is a personal choice, it is not a choice to make lightly. It is a complex choice with many factors to consider and weigh. Here are a few factors to consider when choosing a school.

FACTORS TO CONSIDER

PARENT COMMUNICATION

Effective communication is essential in building a strong relationship between the school and parents. Teachers and administrators should effectively communicate with parents regarding grades, behavior, and general school-related information. Some schools, for example, use "School-to-Home" notebooks to communicate with parents. Others communicate through parent organizations, emails, text messages, or phone calls. No matter what form of communication the school utilizes, effective communication is a very important factor to consider and one you should inquire about when visiting the school.

DISCIPLINE MODEL

Before selecting a school, it is essential to understand their discipline model. Students should be accountable for their behavior. Some behavior intervention strategies used by schools include Behavior Intervention Plans, Restorative Justice, and Social Emotional Learning. Before you send your child to a learning institution, it is important that you understand and agree with the discipline models used at the school. Consider what discipline techniques have worked best for your student and try to find a school that offers similar strategies.



STUDENT ACTIVITIES

While grades, behavior, and test scores are important, student activities outside of the classroom are also important. If your student has a particular interest, such as football, band or drama, try to find a school that offers these activities. Participating in activities during the school day and after school is strongly associated with a students' academic success. The more opportunities your student has to enrich their learning the better!

LOCATION AND TRANSPORTATION

When choosing a school for your student, it is important to consider if the school's location will present future barriers. For example, family or work responsibilities may mean that you are unable to drop your child off to school in the morning. Therefore, you would need a reliable means of transportation to get your child to school on time such as a school bus or van. Many schools offer transportation services, but some do not. Therefore, it is important to know whether or not you will require transportation services in order to get your child to school. If your child will participate in extracurricular activities and requires transportation, consider schools that provide after school transportation services.

SPECIAL EDUCATION

Particularly for parents of children who have special learning needs --it is essential to choose a school that will provide them with the education they deserve. Charter schools are public schools and must provide the services that are outlined in a student's Individualized Education Plan (IEP).

GRADES SERVED AT SCALE

"Grades served at Scale" is a term that describes how many grades the school will serve once it grows to its full size outlined in its charter application. It is important to know what grades will be served at a charter school in the future, especially if you have multiple children and would like for them to attend the same school.

APPLICATION AND REGISTRATION PROCESS

The Common Application ensures all children have fair access to an excellent education and provides families the ease of completing one application that can be submitted online or at ANY participating school for which a student would like to attend.

APPLY ONLINE

Families are encouraged to apply online using the EnrollBR common application system at www.enrollbr.org

- 1. Create a family profile using your personal email address or by logging in with your FACEBOOK or GOOGLE account.
- 2. Apply for a seat for each child by selecting the schools you are interested in for the 2018-19 school year.
- **3.** Be on the lookout for the results of your application, by checking your email and text messages.
- 4. After receiving your results, decide which option best fits your child and accept the seat offer provided by that school.
- 5. Registration information must be submitted by the deadline provided in your application results.

APPLY IN PERSON

Paper Applications are available at most libraries and participating schools. If you are filling out a paper application, please be sure to:

- 1. Fill out a separate application for each child that is applying for a seat.
- 2. Provide an accurate email address in order to receive updated communication.
- 3. Submit the completed paper application to one of the participating schools listed on the application.

APPLICATION TIMELINE

The EnrollBR common application process will consist of a general application round and a post application round. The application timeline is as follows:

General Application – Launches December 6, 2017

Deadline: February 23, 2018, 6:00 PM Results: Released by March 9, 2018

Post Application Round – Launches February 24, 2018

Deadline: Until Seats are filled

Results: Released on a rolling basis

Registration

Deadline for General Applicants: April 6, 2018 6:00 PM

Deadline for Post Applicants: Two weeks after seat acceptance.

Post Application Round Ends: When seats are filled.

If you have any questions about registration, please refer to the email sent from the schools you applied to, or contact the school directly.





Q: Are all Baton Rouge schools a part of the EnrollBR common application system?

A: Only 14 schools in Baton Rouge are a part of the EnrollBR common application process. These schools are a part of the Baton Rouge Achievement Zone (BRAZ).

Q: Why should I use EnrollBR?

A: You should submit a common application through EnrollBR if you are applying to a BRAZ school for the first time, or if you would like to apply to a new BRAZ school next year. Do NOT submit an application if you are satisfied with your child's current school and would like for them to return to that school next year.

Q: What if my preferred school isn't listed on the common application?

A: If your preferred school isn't listed, that means it doesn't participate in the EnrollBR common application process, therefore, you should contact them directly to inquire about how to apply to their school.

Q: I'm looking for Pre-K programs. Can I apply to those through EnrollBR?

A: No, EnrollBR will not include Pre-K programs at this time.

Q: I don't have a computer. What are other ways that I can apply?

A: You can fill out a paper application, which is available at all participating schools, several libraries and partner organizations in Baton Rouge. You can also apply on your mobile phone or at any participating library or school with computer access by visiting www.enrollbr.org.

Q: Do I have to fill out individual paper applications for all of my children?

A: Yes, you must complete a paper application for any child applying for a school. If you are applying online, you will add all children to your family profile and fill out an online application for each child.

Q: Where can I submit my paper application?

A: After completion, you are responsible for dropping off the paper application to one of the BRAZ schools in order for it to be processed. However, you can always skip this step by filling out the common application online at www. enrollbr.org

Q: What materials do I need to apply?

A: You will need an email address, or a Facebook/Google account, and your contact information (Name, phone number).

Q: If I want to change schools, will my current school be notified that I am submitting an application?

A: No. You can safely apply to new schools without your current school knowing.

Q: Do I have to apply to a certain amount of schools?

A: No, you may apply to as many schools as you like. However, you should only apply to schools you actually want to attend.

Q: I already submitted my application, but my information or school preferences have changed. Can I edit my application?

A: Yes, you can edit your application by logging in to the common application at www.enrollbr.org.

Q: Will my child only be offered a seat to the school I checked first on the application?

A: No, your child will be offered a seat at any school you select, as long as there is availability. The order you select your options in does not matter.

Q: If I get offered a seat at a BRAZ school, can I still choose to return to my district school?

A: Yes. If you receive an offer from any one of the BRAZ schools and later decide to return to your district school, you will be able to do so.

Q: If I get offered a seat at a BRAZ school, but change my mind and decide to attend another BRAZ school, will I lose my seat at the first school?

A: Once you select a school and submit your registration information, you forfeit the seat at any other BRAZ school you applied for previously. If you decide to select another school listed, you will need to log in to the portal and send an inquiry to the school to check for seat availability.

Q: If I submit my application earlier, will I have a greater chance of getting my top choice?

A: Yes. We encourage you to apply during the general application window. We cannot guarantee a school will have seats in your desired grade.

Q: Is my child guaranteed a spot at the school where his/her sibling attends?

A: No. Our team is committed to keeping families together whenever possible. However, sometimes there are not enough seats available at a school to accommodate all applicants.

Q: How do I know if a school can accommodate my student with special needs?

A: All BRAZ schools are required to meet your child's needs as identified in his/her Individualized Education Plan (IEP) or 504 Plan. We encourage you to contact schools directly and ask about their special education services and staff. Please note that all K-12 school systems are required to serve your child, regardless of their exceptionality. Refer to school profiles in this guide, for more information.

Q: How does the EnrollBR Common Application differ from OneApp in New Orleans?

A: The common application differs from OneApp in a variety of ways:

- The EnrollBR common application does not provide families with a single best offer. This means that you have the freedom to apply to multiple schools and may be accepted by multiple schools. The final choice is yours and yours alone.
- You do not rank your schools in order of preference.
- You are allowed to select as many schools as you choose.
- Your child is offered a seat based on first come, first serve basis. In New Orleans, students are assigned a school through an algorithm, and are assigned a seat at a particular school.

Q: Once I've submitted the application electronically, how will I know that the submission is successful?

A: Once the application is completed online, you will receive a generated message based on the email address you provided when you created an account.

Q: I live in a nearby school district. Will my child be able to apply to a BRAZ School?

A: No. Only students who reside in the Baton Rouge Parish School District can apply and enroll in our schools.

Q: When will I be notified of my child's acceptance after I submit my application on EnrollBR?

A: General application results will be available after February 23, 2018. Families will be able to view the results in the online application portal, which can be accessed by visiting at www.EnrollBR.org. Applicants will be notified by email (through the address listed on the application) as soon as results are available. If your contact information changes between now and when application results are available, please log in to your family profile and update the information.

Q: What happens after I receive my application results?

A: Once you receive your results, you must claim your child's seat. If you have applied and been accepted to more than one school, you will be expected to choose a school. All families are strongly encouraged to claim their seat as soon as possible.
